# Study on monitoring data and monitoring systems



## **Objective and timing**

- Objectives:

  - 2) to enhance the Commission's and other stakeholders' understanding of the functioning of the programmes' monitoring systems (Task 4)

## State of play: TASK 1&2 project database


The study will:

- collect the list of operations/projects supported under the programmes
- integrate the datasets obtained from managing authorities into a single database
- populate the database with common attributes for all projects/operations: financial information, project description and content, and any other common datafields (+ data cleaning, standardisation & enriching)
- typology clustering of the projects/operations into interventions (beyond the categorization by intervention fields)
- clustering the beneficiaries by type and size




#### **Overview of the Tasks**

#### Questions raised during data collection by the Contractor

• What is asked of Managing Authorities approached by the Contractor?
