Questions & Answers (Q&As)

You will find below a list of questions received for this call for proposals. Please note that the present document aims to complement and clarify the call for proposals and does not replace it. A Q&As document will be periodically published; applicants are invited to check this website regularly.

Q1. How many hours should the course have? I read on Q&A that you recommend a duration of one semester. But if this course is for journalism students it has to give them the opportunity to attend it along BA or MA classes, correct? This course is a complementary and specialized formation, right?

A1. In line with the main aim of the call of setting up a more systematic basic EU training offer as part of the curriculum for journalism studies, the course is intended to complement existing learning opportunities. Taking this into account we recommend indeed a duration of one semester. It is for the applicant to appreciate how to best integrate the course into the existing courses offer, how to ensure that the number of teaching hours are sufficient for meeting the specific objectives, the expected results and outputs of this call for proposals, as well as to explain its choices, in accordance with the award criteria of the call.

Q2. As we are a new organisation resulting from the merge of two entities, we are able to provide the profit and loss account as well as the balance sheet 2020 but for 2019 we would be able to provide it from the 2 institutions which merged. Would it be enough? Or do we have to provide the business plan?

A2. As indicated in Section 8.1 of the Call for proposals, newly created entities must provide the business plan in the case that they cannot provide the profit and loss account and the balance sheet.
