Background



- The investment of €1.5 million under the Ocean Law and Governance Call 2023 was the first commitment pledged by Ireland under the Mission Charter
- Competitive call launched March 2023, closed May 2023, awarded August 2023
- Aim is to assist with the progress needed towards a more integrated maritime governance in Ireland in compliance with national, EU and international commitments and policy goals.
- Result = Five-year Marine Institute funded CoCoMar project
- Partnership project with Queen's University Belfast (Northern Ireland)
- Officially started on 1st November 2023


The CoCoMar project (Grant-Aid Agreement No. PBA/OLG/23/01) is carried out with the support of the Marine Institute under the Marine Research Programme and funded by the Government of Ireland.




CoCoMar outline

- Uses transnational working as a key mechanism to achieve law and policy commitments in an EU Member State (Ireland) and non-EU jurisdiction, Northern Ireland, part of the United Kingdom
- Strong commitment to consider co-location and coexistence in marine plans and other policies but limited demonstration of how this can be achieved in practice
- CoCoMar uses co-existence and co-location as a unifying lens in which to approach the themes of:
 - Fisheries management in a post-Brexit world;
 - Cross compliance of marine sectors governed by Maritime Spatial Planning;
 - Expanding Marine Protected Area networks; and
 - Implementing nature restoration.





Current Irish MPA Network





Irish MPA network includes:

159 Special Areas of Conservation (SACs),
89 Special Protection Areas (SPAs) and
19 OSPAR MPAs

= 8.3% coverage

- General Scheme of Marine Protected Areas Bill 2022 was approved by Government on 13th December 2022.
- Ecological sensitivity analysis of the western Irish Sea to inform future designation of Marine Protected Areas conducted in 2023 and planned for the Celtic Sea.
- Lack of scientific knowledge could result in conservation actions and management interventions being sub-optimal...

CoCoMar work on Irish MPAs



- 1. Produce **compatibility matrices** of different types of MPAs with different types of fisheries and offshore energy in the Irish EEZ;
- Use compatibility matrix outputs to produce appropriate future long-term management options according to type of activity and MPA category;
- Determine implications of the legal definition of Other Effective Conservation Measures (OECMs) for both the Republic and Northern Ireland and how existing legislation may already contribute;
- 4. Explore how OECMs could be identified, legally recognised, supported and reported;
- 5. Develop **advice** on monitoring compliance and minimum requirements for MPAs and OECMs building on tailoring existing guidance to transboundary contexts in cooperation with marine and coastal **stakeholders and regulators**.

CoCoMar contribution to Mission Ocean

PROTECTS AND RESTORE COASTAL AND MARINE ECOSYSTEMS

- Strengthens links with fisheries, energy, and other marine users and between policy areas such as Maritime Spatial Planning and Biodiversity.
- Provides pertinent and timely knowledge to support regulation and policy **transferable lessons** for other EU countries and elsewhere.
- Builds and furthers **research capacity** in Ireland in the area of Oceans Law and Governance.
- Provides opportunities to interact with similar research projects in the EU and international working groups (e.g. ICES, OSPAR, OECD).
