§ The Research Executive Agency (REA)

- § Created 14 Dec. 2007 (Commission Decision EC/2008/46)
- § Director: Graham Stroud started 16 July 2008
- § REA autonomy: 15 June 2009

§ REA is in charge of implementing:

- § SME-specific actions (Capacities)
- **§ Marie Curie actions (People)**
- § Security and Space actions (Cooperation)

§ REA provides also services in support of FP7:

- § Evaluation facility including reception of proposals
- § Registration of beneficiaries (central validation)
- **Secondary Service**

§ 450 people including 24 for Space Research





FP7 Implementation by the Space Research Unit

- § Total budget for Space Research managed by REA:
 - § At present up to €426 millions & 155 projects (first 4 Space calls)
 - **§** Globally around €640 millions for FP7
- 1.In REA, the Space Research unit is in charge of
 - **§** Organising the evaluation of proposals
 - **Negotiation of retained proposals**
 - § Technical & legal monitoring of projects
 - **§ Payments and audit implementation**
- § Policy work remains within the Commission DG ENTR this includes the definition of the space work programme
- § DG ENTR finances directly specific topics identified in the work programme (e.g. development of the Space component of GMES)





Calendar of the call FP7-SPACE-2012-1

- § Call publication: 20 July 2011
- § Call closed: 23 November 2011 17h
- § Remote evaluation: will start 19 December 2011
- § 3 weeks of central evaluation: 30 January 2012 17 February 2012

Outcome of the submission: 189 proposals received



Fundamental principles of the evaluation and selection of projects

- § Excellence. Projects selected for funding must demonstrate a high quality in the context of the topics and criteria set out in the calls.
- § Transparency. Funding decisions must be based on clearly described rules and procedures, and applicants should receive adequate feedback on the outcome of the evaluation of their proposals.
- § Fairness and impartiality. All proposals submitted to a call are treated equally. They are evaluated impartially on their merits, irrespective of their origin or the identity of the applicants.

Relevance of the evaluation

- § The evaluation is a crucial step for the implementation of the FP7 Space Programme – the outcome consists of the lists of ranked proposals (one per budget line)
- § To guaranty a high quality level of the evaluation, we count on the evaluators' capacity to provide a good assessment of the proposals and to ensure consistency between comments and scores

=> This is needed for a fair treatment of the proposals and to provide adequate feedback to applicants!
