Policy Roadmap for the implementation of the Social Investment Package

The European Union is facilitating Member States' progress towards implementing the Social Investment Package through enhanced analysis and monitoring of Member States' policies and social outcomes in the framework of the European Semester, providing financial assistance, and streamlining its governance and reporting. These activities will support Member States' policy reform to help reach the objectives set in the Europe 2020 strategy to reduce the number of people living in poverty and social exclusion by at least 20 million by 2020. The below activities are those where action is planned to be undertaken by mid-2015.
