Austria	<p>Did you know that the Austrian Training Guarantee was even one of the models for the EU Youth Guarantee? If you are looking for a job or apprenticeship in Austria, you can turn to your local job centre (AMS) for placement and advice. If you are under 18, you are guaranteed an apprenticeship position. Under 25 year-olds receive an offer of an apprenticeship, employment, education or training. Finland	<p>If you need help finding a job in Finland, you can turn to your local employment office which will help you with placement and advice. In case you face unemployment register yourself to the employment office via e-service at www.te-palvelut.fi.</p> <p>If you have questions regarding career, education, income or for example housing turn to your local Ohjaamo one-stop-guidance center. Finland has a dedicated website for the Youth Guarantee: http://www.nuorisotakuu.fi. The Youth Guarantee is about taking 3 steps towards employment or education: get in touch, meet an expert, make a plan together with the help of public employment services. Germany	<p>If you need help finding a job or apprenticeship in Germany, you can turn to your local employment agency or - if you are in receipt of unemployment benefit II (Arbeitslosengeld II) - to your local job centre which will help you with placement and advice. Inspired by the Youth Guarantee, some regions in Germany improve their services to young people. The office will help you in finding a job or activation measure that will increase your chance on the labour market. Also if you would like to start your own business, you can find there full information on the support you can count on. In case you are under 18, the best choice will be to contact your local unit of the Voluntary Labour Corps.
