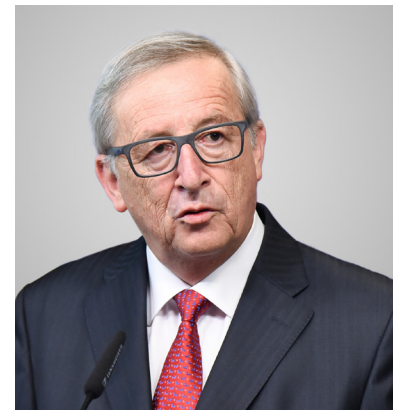

European Solidarity Corps

**The European Solidarity Corps** will provide new opportunities for young Europeans to engage in solidarity activities across Europe, to gain invaluable experience, to develop their skills, and to make a contribution to society. Young people between the ages of 18 and 30 will be able to volunteer or do an internship, apprenticeship, or work where it is needed most and to respond to challenging situations.



# 25%

of young people in the EU say that they have been **involved in an organised voluntary activity** in the past 12 months.



# 80,000

job seekers **are looking for work abroad in solidarity-related sectors.**



# 6%

of young people say that **they have volunteered abroad.** Of those who say they had not done so, **88% say that they did not have the opportunity.**

## THE TARGET

Having **100,000 young people** joining the European Solidarity Corps by the end of 2020.

## THE PLACEMENTS

Placements for the European Solidarity Corps can be **offered by national and local authorities, municipalities, big or small NGOs, and private companies**. All organisations have to adhere to the Charter of the European Solidarity Corps before they can participate.

Placements can last **between 2 and 12 months**.

## TWO POSSIBILITIES

<b>Volunteering strand</b>	To do an internship, apprenticeship or be employed under the <b>occupational strand</b>	
For a volunteering placement, travel costs, lodging, food, insurance and pocket money are covered.	For internships and apprenticeships, there will be an employment contract. Travel costs are covered and a subsistence allowance is paid.	For a job placement, there will be an employment contract and a wage according to national laws. Travel costs are covered.
