#### **Country Summary Tables – Czech Republic**

The aim of this factsheet is to provide an overview of the performance and progress of the operational ESF programmes by country. It shows the aggregated achievements on the output and result indicators, the financial implementation, also providing an overview per investment priority and category of region. However, given the early stage of implementation of most Operational Programmes, the information should be taken with caution and no inference on effectiveness and efficiency should be made.

Section 1 presents data relating to ESF only (excluding ESF matching of YEI); Section 2 presents data relating to YEI only (including ESF matching of YEI).

#### Introductory methodological note

These country summary tables have been prepared as an addition to the Synthesis Report of the ESF Annual Implementation Reports 2016, within the framework of Task 1 of the service "ESF Performance and Thematic Reports". They provide a quantitative overview of ESF performance by presenting country level aggregated financial, output and result data provided by the Managing Authorities in the AIRs 2016 (covering implementation period 2014 and 2015) and extracted from SFC2014 as of 23 February 2017. The tables also provide a measurement of progress in target achievement and of success rates of individuals supported. Data is presented for both ESF and YEI.

Tables are created automatically based on predefined queries extracting data from the SFC2014 Infoview Platform. Each table is introduced by a short description and followed, when relevant, by explanatory notes/disclaimers. For a more detailed methodological explanation please refer to the Synthesis report, section 1.2 Methodology.

In addition to these, we present below some general comments.

For the ESF and YEI, participants should be understood as "participations" similarly to other widely used terms such as 'users', 'spectators' or 'airline passengers'. One participant may participate in several operations. At the same time, an ESF participant returning to the same operation is not counted multiple times. Moreover, indirect participations are excluded from the calculations.

Some of the data presented are susceptible to further changes as a few AIRs are still in the process of being accepted. Furthermore, Managing Authorities can choose whether to report on completed or partially implemented operations: in the first instance this might lead to a certain level of underestimation of achievements. Also note that financial implementation values are not associated to the indicators on physical progress (because the time for the certification of expenditure differs from programme to programme).

Finally, some data of approved AIRs are susceptible to changes in the next reporting periods, as Member States can retroactively modify or update data (e.g. when an individual participation record changes or in order to correct errors).

#### **Country specific notes**

Please be careful when interpreting results in Point 1.3 - one OP doing well can influence the overall figures; moreover, milestones are to be applied by OP so summing may be misleading.

Chapter 3 - division of programmes into categories of regions is not exact as two programmes under less developed regions are in fact multi-objective, there is also (even relatively minor) allocation for more developed regions

Please note that in IP 1.1 = 8i three common indicators (CO01, CO03 and CO09) were by mistake entered with the national ID and thus changed to be specific; it should be ensured that their values would be summed up as well in the overall figures until it will be corrected in the programme which can take some years as it will be done only at the occasion of an amendment



# **1.2.4 Common Output Indicators included in the Performance Framework**No data available/does not apply

Note: The data in this table is calculated by summing the cumulative achievement and 2018 milestone grouped by CCI number, Priority axis ID (PA\_ID) and indicator ID (CO\_ID). After that the achievement and milestone values are linked by CCI, PA\_ID and CO\_ID, so that only achievements from the corresponding priority axis and indicator is included when comparing to the indicator from the performance framework. Finally, the values are summed up at common indicator level. Only indicators that are also included in the Performance Framework Indicators in their respective programmes are considered (i.e., Table 6 in Operational Programmes).

#### 1.2.5 Success rates

Success rates are calculated by dividing the total cumulative achievements of the common result indicator (CRI) by the total cumulative achievements of the corresponding common output indicator (COI). This way the output indicator is used as a basis for target setting.

Success rates are different from target achievement rates as they provide an indication of the extent to which participants achieved a given result.
