Situation of single parents

SINGLE PARENTS

- Every 7th household with children, over 165 thousand families (2013).
- 90 % of single parents are women.
- 404 000 children grew up in single parent households, vs. 1 390 000 (2011 census data, 10 400 000 the whole adult population).
- The divorce rate is 45–50 %, and share of divorces where children are involved is over 50 %.
- Single mothers have usually less children than would they prefer.

POVERTY

- Risk of poverty rate is 34,4 % for single parents
 - only 6,2 % for families with two parents and one child and 9,1 % for families with two children.
- Main explanatory factors: income and employment status (of all household members), household structure.

CHALLENGES

Work-life balance, risk of poverty, isolation, recoverability of alimony



Policy framework

Family Policy Strategy (18. 9. 2017)

- The key principle is the free choice of people there is no statement on the preferred type of family.
- The measures are designed according the needs and with knowledge of the trends, not to support certain specific type of families (e.g. married couples).
- Single parents need special support the advance alimony, precautions
- Taxes, benefits and services the Strategy suggests the higher support of services
 - ☐ Housing, childcare services, other services for families
 - ☐ Problem with the spouse tax credit single mothers can't use this



Assesment of the policy measures

Financial, material and social support available to single parents

- Social system in Czech Republic does not provide categorical benefits to single parents.
- Single parents are entitled to, as other families are, family benefits (non insurance), pensions and social insurance benefits.
- Single parents have better chance of qualifying for some meanstested benefits (due to their lower incomes).
- Longer period of sickness insurance benefit in case of caring for a family member.



Family and social benefits

- Benefits provided to families in socially disadvantaged situation
- Universal benefit:
 - ➤ Parental allowance total amount of EUR 8 462 is to be distributed up to 4 years of childrens age
- Means-tested benefits:
 - Child allowance from EUR 19 to EUR 27 according to child's age (dependent child up to 26 years)
 - Housing allowance
 - Birth grant for low-income families, EUR 500 for the first child and EUR 385 for the second child
 - better chance of qualifying and receiving higher amount for single parents (due to missing income of partner or alimony).



Family and social benefits

ASSISTANCE IN MATERIAL NEED (specific benefit)

- ➤ Eligible: families and individuals who do not have sufficient income to satisfy the basic needs.
- > Income-tested benefit.
- Alimony is part of the total household income used for the income test.
- Single parents receive a higher amount of benefit if alimony is not payed by the partner.

STATISTICS

- Half of single parents receive Child allowance,
- Nearly half of them Housing allowance and
- Under 20 % is qualified to Assistance in material need.



Advance alimony- legislative proposal

- Advance payment of alimony by the state.
- An advance alimony paid by the state to lone parents who do not get alimony from their partner still does not exist in Czech Republic.
 - Legislative proposal has been submitted to the Parliament four times since 2001 (most recently this year).
 - Uncertain due to coming election this year.
