- Jobseekers are classified into groups based on:
 - Assessment of qualification and competencies;
 - Assessment of work experience;
 - Assessment of motivation (readiness to participate actively in the active labour market measures);
 - Other criteria (social skills, family liabilities, health problems, addictions, travel to work, etc.).
- Jobseekers receive individualized services and support based on their needs and abilities to compete in the labour market;
- More effective, smooth and more client-orientated services.






- Bilateral commitment between jobseeker and PES;
- Only realistic employment objectives and actions to achieve them are planned;
- Prepared after discussion on perspectives in the labour market, employment possibilities, wishes of the unemployed, measures of support needed;
- Failure to follow the plan leads to sanctions.

Motivation

- Measures for motivation/activation:
 - Information and consulting, job mediation;
 - Career planning individual counselling and group counselling;
 - Vocational guidance individual counselling, labour market barometers;
 - Special services psychological counselling;
 - Projects of social partners participation in projects, information events, prevention programs.
- Motivating factors:
 - Salary;
 - Interesting work;
 - Friendly working conditions;
 - Recognition;
 - Career opportunities.




Activation – active labour market measures



Activation - employment enhancing programme

- Target groups to participate:
 - Social support beneficiaries;
 - Groups of social risk;
 - Addicted after rehabilitation programs;
 - 40+, etc.
- Measures:
 - Temporary job;
 - Support for mobility;
 - Measures to prevent social exclusion, etc.



Inclusion of labour market partners - cooperation with municipality

- Direct interaction:
 - Increasing cooperation rational use of funds for social support;
 - Exchange of data registration at PES, allocation of social benefits;
 - Implementation of employment support employment enhancing programme;
 - Case management pilot.





- Cooperation on general issues in relation to employment issues:
 - Exchange of information;
 - Participation in events;
 - Participation in committees, councils, etc.

NEW EMPLOYMENT POSSIBILITIES (2017) 13685 (57 % of jobseekers)


Permanent job – 7482 (31 %)
