

The 5 principles for implementation

- 1. Do not go beyond minimum implementation
- 2. Do not put Danish businesses at a disadvantage
- 3. Use flexibility and derogations where possible
- 4. Look for alternatives to regulation
- 5. Do not come into force before transposition deadline





3 core acitivities

1. Proactive political lobbying

➤ Identifying *future* EU regulation, where there is a need for early and proactive action to avoid unnecessary burdens.

2. Implementering new EU legislation into national law


Preventing unnecessary, potentially burdensome issues to be introduced when new EU legislation is transposed into Danish law.

3. "Neighbour check"

Checking existing implementation of EU regulation against practices and approaches in other Member States in order to identify more efficient ways of implementation.

Total number of laws and regulations implementing EU business regulation	173
Of these the number of laws and regulations not harmonising with the 5 principles	22
Cases with proactive political lobbying	47
Completed "Neigbour checks"	33
