





were carried out by the National Labour Inspectorate

98% of inspections

94,700 improvement notices

4900 verbal instructions

14% of inspections


**2500 disciplinary measures**

Over **97,000 pieces of advice** were offered with regard to legal protection of labour, legality of employment and work safety.

#### NLI's educational programme Safety culture

The programme is addressed to students of secondary schools and universities

#### The programme aims to:

popularise the idea of safe work as a standard in future working life,

- raise awareness of hazards in the working environment,
- instill the knowledge of labour law, including OSH.



#### NLI's communication campaigns - exemplary initiatives



- Target group: students and young persons commencing professional activity
- **Objectives**: raising awareness of legal employment, labour protection, as well as basic OSH issues such as OSH training and medical examinations
- Cooperation with over 40 universities
- Over 700 training events with nearly 26,000 people trained

- Target group: workers and employers of high risk sectors
- **Objectives**: striving for prevention of workplace accidents caused by human error including incorrect or unauthorised actions of workers
- 710 training events and information meetings
- Promotion of the campaign's messages in mass media

# Promotion of proper attitudes and good practice - competition "Employer – organiser of safe work"

The competition promotes companies where care for work safety exceeds legal standards.

The competition is conducted at a regional and national level.

It includes three categories of workplaces: small, medium and large.

Participants are evaluated in terms of their compliance with legal provisions on safe work organization, as well as implementation of technical solutions to improve safety and health protection of workers.

Winners of the national level are awarded a statuette "Mecum Tutissimus Ibis" and are entered in the NLI's golden list of employers.

# Employers' and workers' views upon work safety – social survey conducted by the NLI

Survey performed on a sample of **1065 workers** at the age of **18-65**.

59% of all respondents thought their knowledge of labour law was rather poor or very poor
89% of respondents stated that young people should be advised of their worker rights and obligations during school education

• **52%** of work organizers thought that the level of safety in their workplace was fairly high, and 34% considered it high

50% of respondents saw the need to increase direct supervision on the part of managers, and 43% - the need to provide extra training for workers, while 38% believed that workers should be punished for hazardous behaviour
50% of respondents thought that provision of guidance should be the main task of the National Labour Inspectorate.

Survey performed on a sample of 400 people responsible for taking key decisions in the area of occupational safety and health in workplaces.

#### **Conclusions and recommendations**



- Employers have a major role to play in fostering safety culture
- ✓ OSH regulators should support employers in activities aimed at educating workers

activity of the National Labour Inspectorate in the area of labour protection aims to develop work safety culture and legal compliance not only through supervision and inspection, but also through various forms of social communication and involvement of all stakeholders responsible for work safety and labour protection issues.

> cooperation of different institutions concerned with labour protection is vital for developing proper attitudes and building safety culture.

> cooperation with the mass media is also crucial as they constitute an easily accessible source of information on OSH and labour law for Polish employers and workers
