### International standards in labour statistics

- Adopted by the International Conference of Labour Statisticians (ICLS)
  - Resolutions
  - Guidelines
- Adopted by the International Labour Conference (ILC)
  - Conventions (C160)
  - Recommendations (R170)



### Conclusions of the 20<sup>th</sup> ICLS (October 2018)

#### Four resolutions

- statistics on work relationships (Revision of International Classification of Status in Employment: ICSE-93 to ICSE-18 and International Classification of Status at Work: ICSaW-18)
- the methodology of the SDG Indicator 8.8.2 on labour rights (FoA and Collective Bargaining)
- the methodology of the SDG Indicator 8.b.1 on youth employment strategies
- to amend the 18th ICLS Resolution concerning statistics of child labour

#### Four Guidelines

- statistics on international labour migration
- the measurement of forced labour
- the measurement of qualifications and skills mismatches of persons in employment
- statistics of cooperatives



### Other issues discussed at the 20<sup>th</sup> ICLS

- Implementation of the 19<sup>th</sup> ICLS resolution concerning statistics of work, employment and labour underutilization
- Revising framework for measuring informality (main topic for the next ICLS)
- Revision of International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO-08)
- Measuring volunteer work
- Role of big data in labour statistics



# Convention 160 concerning labour statistics (1985)

- Comittment from countries to report on basic labour statistics
- 50 ratifications so far, 20 from UfM member states




# Why ratify ILO Convention 160 concerning labour statistics (1985)?

- Compliance with International Labour Standards
- Commits to monitoring progress towards SDGs and Decent Work through reporting on indicators
- Not much additional reporting requirements
- Flexible in ratifying partially by choosing one or more sections of the convention
- Reducing the scope of ratification at any time in future




### Potential of ratifying Convention 160





## Global Indicator Framework to monitor SDGs





### **ILO** custodian SDG indicators

#### **ILO** sole or joint custodian for 13 SDG indicators

- 1.3.1 Proportion of population covered by social protection floors/systems ...
- 5.5.2 Proportion of women in managerial positions
- 8.2.1 Annual growth rate of real GDP per employed person
- 8.3.1 Proportion of informal employment in non-agriculture employment, by sex
- 8.5.1 Average hourly earnings of female and male employees, by occupation, age and persons with disabilities
- 8.5.2 Unemployment rate, by sex, age and persons with disabilities
- 8.6.1 Proportion of youth (aged 15-24 years) not in education, employment or training
- 8.7.1 Proportion and number of children aged 5-17 years engaged in child labour, by sex and age
- 8.8.1 Frequency rates of fatal and non-fatal occupational injuries, by sex and migrant status
- 8.8.2 Level of national compliance of labour rights (FACB) based on ILO textual sources ...
- 8.b.1 Existence of a developed and operationalized national strategy for youth employment ...
- 10.4.1 Labour share of GDP, comprising wages and social protection transfers
- 10.7.1 Recruitment cost borne by employee as a proportion of yearly income earned in country of destination
