Context

When the COVID-19 pandemic arrived in Europe, Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) and the self-employed were expected to be particularly affected by the crisis. They have experienced subsequent reductions in demand for their services, and a sudden loss of revenue which has severely affected their ability to function. Once initial lockdowns ended and even whilst several sectors were still on hold, many employers started to look for new employees whilst having to adapt to new working conditions (rules related to hygiene, distancing, smart-working, etc.).

SMEs comprise over 95% of employers in the EU; however, this is not reflected in the proportion of vacancies placed with PES. In the post-COVID period it is especially important that PES adapt their systems to the new situation, in order to deliver relevant services to SMEs and self-employed people. Many different national policies (Short Term Work schemes, loans, reallocation of EU funds, deferment of the payment of taxes, dedicated PES staff, etc.) have been implemented across the EU to support SMEs, but considerable untapped potential remains for PES to provide HR and other support to assist these employers.

The webinar will explore how PES can assist recovery from the crisis. PES will present their strategies, measures and tools for providing support services with a focus on SMEs and the self-employed.
