Context

This webinar is the sixth of a special series exploring PES responses to the COVID-19 crisis and possible ways forward to effectively support the recovery. This webinar focuses upon PES experiences in supporting young jobseekers, which are among the groups disproportionately impacted by the crisis.

Young people have been particularly hard hit by the COVID-19 pandemic, their transitions from education to work have been slowed down (if not halted) by lockdowns and social distancing measures and worsening economic conditions. However many of the relief measures adopted across EU countries mostly benefit the "established workforce", i.e. people on permanent or long-term contracts. Combatting youth unemployment has been an EU policy priority for a number of years, as reflected in the support provided for this group through the Youth Guarantee, and this will need to continue in order to support the labour market recovery. Experience from the previous crisis illustrates the scarring effects of long term unemployment, with young jobseekers particularly prone to facing barriers to labour market entry following periods of inactivity. Evidence suggests that personalised, co-ordinated, interventions are required to support people with particular barriers to integration.

The webinar speakers and participants will discuss how policy responses are addressing the risk of young jobseekers falling further behind and how PES can work with other stakeholders to prepare for and deliver more targeted services and efficient support for them. The webinar will also feature inputs from young people and employers on their experience and suggestions on how PES can effectively support them through the crisis and promote rapid labour market recovery. The aim of the webinar is therefore to identify the optimum combination of two approaches: i.e. the continuation and further development of well-established measures on the one hand, and the integration of new approaches and initiatives implemented in the wake of the pandemic on the other.
