- short CVs of the proposed persons (knowledge of EaSI)
- consortium participants,
- list of previous projects
- C1 level of English for project manager
- B2 level of English for members of the help desk
- Previous experience of running a website or public events.



### Eligibility - countries

- EU Member State (including overseas countries and territories (OCTs))
- listed EEA countries (i.c. Norway, Iceland)
- countries associated to the ESF+ (associated countries) or countries which are in ongoing negotiations for an association agreement and where the agreement enters into force before grant signature



### Eligibility - Specific cases

- Natural persons are NOT eligible (with the exception of self-employed persons, i.e. sole traders, where the company does not have legal personality separate from that of the natural person).
- International organisations are NOT eligible.
- EU bodies can NOT be part of the consortium



### Other

- Financial support to third parties is not allowed.
- Proposals must relate to activities taking place in the eligible countries.
- Projects should have a duration of 24 months(extensions are exceptionally possible, if duly justified and through an amendment).
- Projects are ideally between EUR 40 000 and EUR 130 000, but this does not preclude the submission/selection of proposals requesting other amounts.

#### What is the Application Form?

The Application Form is the template for EU grants applications; it must be submitted via the EU Funding & Tenders Portal before the call deadline.

The Form consists of 2 parts:

- Part A contains structured administrative information
- Part B is a narrative technical description of the project.

Part A is generated by the IT system. It is based on the information which you enter into the Portal Submission System screens.

Part B needs to be uploaded as PDF (+ annexes) in the Submission System. The templates to use are available there.

#### How to prepare and submit It?

The Application Form must be prepared by the consortium and submitted by a representative. Once submitted, you will receive a confirmation.

#### Character and page limits:

- page limit normally 70 pages (unless otherwise provided in the Call document)
- supporting documents can be provided as an annex and do not count towards the page limit.
- minimum font size Arial 9 points
- page size: A4
- margins (top, bottom, left and right): at least 15 mm (not including headers & footers).

Please abide by the formatting rules. They are NOT a target! Keep your text as concise as possible. Do not use hyperlinks to show information that is an essential part of your application.

If you attempt to upload an application that exceeds the specified limit, you will receive an automatic warning asking you to shorten and re-upload your application. For applications that are not shortened, the excess pages will be made invisible and thus disregarded by the evaluators.

Please do NOT delete any instructions in the document. The overall page limit has been raised to ensure equal treatment of all applicants.

By clicking 'additional options' users can further differentiate between 'grants', 'prizes', 'public procurement', etc.

Last but not least, some selected EaSI projects can be consulted at the European Commission's overview 'Examples of EU funded projects', by clicking 'advanced search' and selecting 'Employment and Social Innovation' in the 'programme name' box.

Furthermore, the <u>ESF+ EaSI page at the Funding and Tenders portal</u> also hosts the 'What's New' section with news about the EaSI strand. Here the Commission will inform about events concerning EaSI, including those organised in your country and publish articles informing about the strand. This news will also be published at the ESF+ page at...

#### The ESF+ EaSI Technical Working Group representative of your country

The EaSI strand is supported by the EaSI Technical Working Group under the ESF+ Committee, which is composed of the European Commission and government representatives of the Member States, as well as of third countries associated to the strand. ## Who can be an NCP?

Which is the national / regional or local authority that has the authorisation to operate a NCP in a country?

This depends from the country's own institutional structures. In federal countries, the regions may have the authority to designate a body as part of the national contact point, while in other countries this is purely the competence of the national authority. The bottom-line is that this authority is responsible for the European Social Fund plus, and its Employment and Social Innovation strand. Only one contact point will be designated per country.
