
- The European Learning Model (ELM) allows interoperability of Learning Opportunities, Qualifications and Credentials in Europe
- The ELM is linked to existing frameworks and classifications (e.g. EQF/NQF, ESCO, ISCED-f)
- European Digital Credentials for Learning (EDCs) can describe any formal or non-formal learning
- EDCs are digital verifiable credentials that must be signed with an eIDAS-compliant electronic seal
- EDCs are securely stored in standardcompliant wallets (e.g. Europass), and controlled by their owners



## Multilingual vocabulary to describe skills and occupations




ELM uses the multilingual classification of European Skills, Competences, Qualifications and Occupations (ESCO) to describe <u>knowledge and skills</u> achieved and <u>occupations</u> a person is entitled to practice




