Commission Communication - 23 March

"Welcoming those fleeing Ukraine: Readying Europe to meet the needs"

Actions taken to support Member States in meeting the needs of those fleeing Ukraine and its people, including actions around:

- Protection for children
- Access to healthcare
- Accommodation
- Access to education
- Access to labour market



Temporary Protection Directive – 4 March

- The EU activated the Temporary Protection Directive.
- Legal right to stay in a EU Member State.
- For an initial period of 1 year, which can be extended up to 3 years.
- Enabling access to education and training, labour market, healthcare, housing and social welfare.
- Operational guidelines are published online to support Member States in applying the Temporary Protection Directive.

ESF, FEAD and ESF+ support to third-country nationals (TCNs) and migrants



ESF support to integration

- "Migrants, asylum seekers and refugees" (recital 6 ESF reg.) may receive support that facilitates their social inclusion and integration in the labour market
- ESF support provided they legally have access to the labour market
 - Access to the labour market as per directive 2013/33/EU & temporary protection directive – all people fleeing UA have temporary protection as of day 1 in the EU
- A mainstream approach: third-country nationals to access any ESF measure
- Type of support depends on needs and thematic objectives
- Targeted measures for migrants are possible



ESF: Examples of measures – 2014-2020

Employment

- Counselling, mentoring in relation to the labour market (information about training opportunities, help with CV writing, recognition of competences, activation measures)
- Hiring of teachers
- Hiring of staff working at the borders to welcome refugees
- Work placements, training, language courses in relation to work
- Measures to overcome segregation, prejudice and discrimination against third-country nationals, in particular in the labour market
- Support to training and employment institutions (adapt programmes and offer to needs; drafting recommendations on competences and skills)
- Prevention of undeclared work, support to social economy

Social inclusion

Inclusion

- "one-stop-shops" and integrated services and counselling (psychosocial, housing, employment...)
- Anti-discrimination programmes and measures (education, labour market) incl. prevention
- Social care and assistance
- Child care and foster care
- Community-based care for people with disabilities, children and older people notably

Education

- Guidance and mentoring
- Apprenticeships, traineeships
- Inclusive education
- Creation of additional school places;
 language courses for children and parents
- Assessment of children's needs (language courses, extra support...)
- Extracurricular activities, meals, transport, school equipment
- Hiring and training of teachers and staff



ESF+ support: an overview

EMPLOYMENT

- (a) Access to employment of all jobseekers
- (b) Modernising labour market institutions and services
- (c) Gender-balanced labour market participation, work/life balance
- (d) adaptation of workers & enterprises, well-adapted working environment, active & healthy ageing

EDUCATION TRAINING

- (e) Improving the quality, effectiveness and labour market relevance of education and training systems
- (f) Promoting equal access to and completion of, quality and inclusive education
- (g) Lifelong learning, re- and upskilling, anticipating change and new skills requirements

SOCIAL INCLUSION

- (h) Active inclusion
- (i) Promoting socio-economic integration of third-country nationals, including migrants
- (j) promoting socio-economic integration of marginalised communities such as the Roma
- (k) Equal and timely access to services; social protection, healthcare systems and long term care
- (I) Social integration of people at risk of poverty and social exclusion
- (m) Addressing material deprivation, including accompanying measures

- → Same type of support to third-country nat. as 2014-2020
- → Measures formerly under FEAD now included: basic assistance, food, hygiene...



FEAD: Examples of measures – 2014-2020

1) Food and/or basic material assistance

- food support (e.g. food packages or meals);
- basic material assistance (e.g. clothing, footwear, hygiene, school material, sleeping bags).
- Accompanying measures

 (e.g psychological support, reorientation to social services)

2) Social inclusion

- Determined by MS in line with their definitions.
- Bringing recipients to other existing services
- Basic language courses
- Civic orientation
- health promotion activities



CARE – Cohesion Action for Refugees in Europe



CARE – Cohesion Action for Refugees in Europe

- Amends the 2014-2020 CPR and FEAD Regulations
- Concerns REACT-EU as well
- The overarching aim is two-fold:
 - ➤ Allows MS to have a greater degree of flexibility in the use of their remaining 2014-2020 cohesion policy resources to address the challenges created by the inflows of persons due to the military aggression by Russia.
 - Enables Member States to request application of a 100% EU co-financing rate for one or more priority axes in a programme supported by the ERDF, the ESF or the Cohesion Fund for the accounting year 2021-2022, by way of notification to the Commission.

Supporting the integration of Ukrainians in the VET sector (actions managed by NAs)




KA1-Learning mobility of individuals

- Ukrainian VET learners can be welcomed quickly by vocational education and training institutions with ongoing Erasmus+ KA1 projects, with flexible use of project funding for people with fewer opportunities.
- Ukrainian teachers and trainers are eligible for teaching and training assignments.
- Qualified staff can be sent to regions where refugees are accommodated.
- Institutions can invite teachers, trainers and other relevant experts, including Ukrainians, to join temporarily and support with their expertise organisations hosting refugees.

KA2-Partnerships for cooperation projects

- Institutions benefiting from ongoing Erasmus+ projects, specially those working in areas such as inclusion, diversity and integration of refugees may, on a voluntary basis, reallocate part of their funds in support of activities for Ukrainian refugees.
- Interested organisations can apply for new Small-scale partnerships in the fields of vocational education and training (deadline: 4 October 2022).
- The European Commission and the National Agencies encourage applicants to include in their proposals activities linked to the integration of refugees, the promotion of European common values or the fight against disinformation and fake news.






eTwinning supports Ukrainian teachers and students

- Comparison between the Ukrainian Qualifications Framework and the EQF is underway.
- What is comparison of the EQF with the NQF?

EQF Recommendation 13:

Recommends Commission and Member States to explore possibilities for the development and application of criteria and procedures to enable, ... the comparison of third countries' national and regional qualifications frameworks with the EQF

- 4. Joint presentation on the Comparison pilot in the EQF Advisory Group




The EU Skills Profile Tool for Third Country Nationals is available in Ukrainian

- Multilingual online tool to identify and document the skills of third country nationals (notably migrants and refugees entering Europe);
- To be used by national authorities, reception and integration centres, PES organizations, NGO's and other services in dialogue between migrant and adviser;
- To issue personalized guidance on further steps;
- To facilitate integration into the labour market;
- Upcoming integration with the Europass portal.

Recognition of qualifications for persons fleeing war in Ukraine

Recognition of qualifications

- More than 4 million people fleeing war in Ukraine
- Refugees often at high risk of exploitation and poor working conditions
- Recognition of professional qualifications so that people can work in jobs corresponding to their qualification level
- High need for healthcare, childcare and teaching professionals to support persons arriving in Europe
- Recognition of qualifications for persons granted temporary protection taking place on national level (national rules & procedure)



Recognition of qualifications

- Commission Recommendation on the recognition of qualifications for persons fleeing war in Ukraine, covering:
 - fast and efficient recognition processes;
 - use of electronic tools and resources, such as eTranslation, and a resource hub on Ukrainian qualifications;
 - methods to apply when applicants do not have their diplomas
 - recognition of specific groups of professionals, in particular healthcare, childcare and teaching professionals;
 - arrangements for a follow up of the Recommendation in close cooperation with Member States and Ukrainian authorities.
- Indicative date for adoption: next week


