It is firmly anchored in the principles of the <u>European Pillar of Social Rights</u> and supports the goals of the <u>Green Deal</u> and the <u>digital</u> transformation, as set out in the Commission communication "A strong Social Europe for Just Transitions".

The Pact aims to mobilise and incentivise private and public stakeholders to take concrete action for the **up skilling and reskilling of people of working age**, and, when relevant, pool efforts in the partnerships.

The Pact can be joint by any private or public organisation or partnership of organisations which aim to upskill or reskill people of working age.

The organisation(s) need(s) to be based in one of the Member States, EFTA or candidate countries.

Joining the Pact:

- 1. All stakeholders joining the Pact **sign up to the Charter** and its key principles, which they agree to respect and uphold.
- 2. Signatories of the Pact are invited to **translate their engagement into concrete commitments** on upskilling and reskilling. Commitments must be in line with the key principles and can be built around a number of "enablers" that illustrate concrete ways of implementing the different principles.
- 3. Commitments are monitored by at least one **key performance indicator**, e.g. number of people taking part in upskilling or reskilling.
