- Individual job search assistance, case management and general information services;
- Training and re-training;
- Promotion of entrepreneurship;

Allowances for training, mobility, back to education, job search and entrepreneurship.

RESULTS - GOOD PRACTICES

- At the end of the intervention, 52% of the workers who participated in the measures (920) was back into employment, 835 (91%) as dependent workers and 85 (9%) as self-employed persons. About 44% of the beneficiaries were unemployed and 4% was in education or training.
- Most of the dependent workers were reemployed in permanent positions (62.5%), 16% got fixed-term contracts and another 15% were agency workers.
- The intervention aimed at allowing NEETs to find a job, to integrate a qualifying training or to resume studies. After the support, half of the participants were either employed (23.3%) or had been/were in education or training (25.8%).
- The EGF assistance focuses on the workers having the most difficulties in getting back into the labour market. Therefore, a reintegration rate of 52% can be considered as successful, in particular when workers aged 50+, represented 40% of the total of dismissed workers.
- The young people underlined the personalization and the quality of the support received, the positive effects on their sociability, personal development and self-confidence, and the improvement in terms of quality and efficiency of their job search activities
