

PES Network Board puts support for Ukrainian refugees, youth and persons with disabilities high on the agenda

The PES Network Board of 23-24 June met with European Commissioner Nicolas Schmit and French Minister Olivier Dussopt for an open exchange on the latest support offered by the EU and PES across Europe to people fleeing Russian aggression in Ukraine.

The Board, held in Lille under the French Presidency, also discussed key questions around: labour market integration of young people in the context of the European Year of Youth; improving access to employment of persons with disabilities; the 4th cycle of the PES Network's Benchlearning project; and how PES can benefit from the use of artificial intelligence.
