What is the European Digital Skills Certificate?

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The <u>European Digital Skills Certificate (EDSC)</u> will be a **tool to help people get their digital skills recognised across Europe** by employers,
governments, training providers, and more. The EDSC will be based on the <u>European Digital</u>
<u>Competence Framework</u> (DigComp) and is a concrete action of the <u>Digital Education Action Plan</u>.



What are the objectives?

- Enhancing recognition of digital skills through minimum quality requirements
- Omplementing existing digital skills certifications
- Allowing people to indicate their level of digital skills
- Encouraging people to acquire new digital skills

The EDSC pilot

As part of the Digital Education and Skills Package and as a deliverable of the <u>European Year of Skills</u>, today, **the Commission is launching a pilot with several Member States**. Finland, Spain, Austria and Romania have expressed their interest to participate. **The pilot will test the practical use of an EDSC** in work, education and training.

Accreditation systems of certificate-issuing bodies



Guidelines for certificate-issuing hodies



Financial sustainability

Next steps

- The results of the pilot will be presented as part of a <u>feasibility study on the EDSC</u> towards year-end.
- The final European Digital Skills Certificate will be rolled out in 2024, based on the pilot and the study.
