The Annex to Commission Decision C(2022)6798 is amended as follows:

(1) Point 1.2 is amended as follows:

1.2. "Type of actions to be financed:

- for grants (implemented under direct management) (point 2): EUR 400 000
- for prizes (implemented under direct management) (point 3): N/A
- for procurement (implemented under direct management) (point 4): EUR 17 790 000
- for actions implemented under indirect management (point 5): EUR 5 000 000
- for contributions to trust funds (point 6): N/A
- for financial instruments (point 7): N/A
- for contributions to blending facilities (point 8): N/A
- for other actions or expenditure (point 9): EUR 810 000"

(2) In section "4. Procurement", first paragraph is amended as follows:

4. "Procurement

The indicative global budgetary envelope reserved for procurement contracts under this work programme amounts to EUR 17 790 000."

(3) Section "5. Actions implemented under indirect management" is amended as follows:

5. "Actions implemented under indirect management

The indicative overall budgetary allocation reserved for actions implemented under indirect management under this work programme amounts to EUR 5 000 000."

(4) In section "5. Actions implemented under indirect management", point 5.2 is added as follows:

"5.2. Contribution agreement with the UNICEF for implementing actions related to social inclusion and provision of services to Ukrainian refugee children in Poland Implementing entity

Entrusted implementation tasks and funds to the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), on the basis of Articles 62(c)(ii) and 154 of the Financial Regulation.

UNICEF is an agency of the United Nations, which is responsible for providing humanitarian and developmental aid to children worldwide. The agency is among the most widespread and recognizable social welfare organizations in the world, with a presence in 192 countries and territories. UNICEF's activities include providing immunizations and disease prevention, administering treatment for children and mothers with HIV, enhancing childhood and maternal nutrition, improving sanitation, promoting education, and providing emergency relief in response to disasters.

Objectives pursued

Fostering active socio-economic inclusion of Ukrainian refugee children in Poland, enhancing equal and timely access to quality, sustainable and affordable services, including healthcare, education, social protection and housing.

Expected results

De-institutionalisation of Ukrainian children

Description of the activities to be funded

The action is addressing the needs of the children fleeing Ukraine and currently residing in large reception facilities in Poland, in line with the deinstitutionalisation requirements (following the United Nations Convention on the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, UNCRPD) and including their relocation needs, accommodation in smaller groups facilities, care services and socio-psychological services needed for the purpose.
