# 9.1. Pilot project: Documenting the best practices from experiences concerning the organisation and reduction of working time in Europe

## Description and objective of the implementing measure

In a context of high labour shortages and changes in working practices, including the shift towards teleworking, working time reduction is high on the political agenda. By examining evidence on this issue, the pilot project will contribute to the objective of a fair transition for better employment, working conditions and social inclusion.

The pilot project will collect evidence on working time reduction and reorganisation practices implemented by companies and gather information on working time reduction policies implemented by governments in Europe. It will summarize strengths and weaknesses of the different practices across EU Member States and their impact on several individual, company and societal outcomes (including on job quality, work-life balance, productivity and training take-up). The best practices of working time reduction will be disseminated to a broad audience.

The extension of the pilot project will allow expanding its results with a more in-depth literature review, additional firm-level case studies, further deliverables relying on economic research (based on the collection of new survey data, additional statistical analysis and modelling activities), as well as with further communication events and materials (including videos).

Furthermore, the extension will also allow for the organisation of hybrid meetings with relevant stakeholders (employers, social partners, academic researchers and national and EU-level policy-makers) to exchange views on working time reduction experiments and policies. These discussions will take place in different Member States and will cover various aspects of the impact of working time reduction.

The project will summarize and publish the research work as well as the main takeaways of the events in a way accessible to a broad audience.
