



# Questions and Answers

<b>Call reference:</b>	EAC/S16/2017
<b>Title:</b>	Sport as a tool for integration and social inclusion of refugees
<b>Version:</b>	3

<b>Question 1</b>	<b>Can we organise a meeting, or have telephone or e-mail contacts with the European Commission in order to get feedback on our project and/or ideas before submitting an application?</b>
Answer	In the light of the principles of equal treatment and fair competition, contacts during the submission phase are allowed solely for the purpose of clarifying the content of the published documents concerning this call for proposals. Contacts must always take place in writing, preferably by email. Any additional information provided by the European Commission will be accessible simultaneously to all operators on DG EAC website, in the Q&A section. Except in the case of clarification, the Commission is not allowed to answer to requests for feedback and/or opinion concerning the content of potential proposals or project ideas.
<b>Question 2</b>	<b>Is there a deadline for asking clarifications about the call for proposals (please refer also to question n.1)?</b>
Answer	Clarifications may be asked up to the 4th August 2017, by email, to: <a href="mailto:eac-sport@ec.europa.eu">eac-sport@ec.europa.eu</a> . The recommended procedure is to fix a deadline for the submission of questions before the final deadline for applications. This allows replies to all questions to be published in the Q&A section, through updated versions of this Q&A document, ensuring therefore transparency and equality of treatment.
<b>Question 3</b>	<b>Is there a deadline for asking translations of the call for proposals in other EU languages?</b>
Answer	Translations can be requested up to the 28th July 2017. Requests must be sent by email, to: <a href="mailto:eac-sport@ec.europa.eu">eac-sport@ec.europa.eu</a>
<b>Question 4</b>	<b>Is it possible to apply in partnership with other entities or only one single applicant may apply?</b>
Answer	Applications must be submitted by a single legal entity.
<b>Question 5</b>	<b>Do projects have to include a transnational partnership?</b>

Answer	No. The eligibility conditions do not mention the need for a transnational partnership. However transnational or national partnership are not excluded, as long as the applications are submitted by a single legal entity
<b>Question 6</b>	<b>Can activities be implemented outside the EU?</b>
Answer	No. Activities must be implemented in the EU.
<b>Question 7</b>	<b>Is my organisation eligible to apply?</b>
Answer	As specified in section 6.1 of the call for proposals EAC/S16/2017, "In order to be eligible, projects must be presented by public or private organisations with legal personality who are active in the sport field and organise sport activities. Natural persons are not eligible to apply for a grant under this call.". The same section specifies the list of supporting documents that are requested in order to assess the applicants' eligibility. Please note that the assessment of eligibility of applicants is part of the evaluation procedure, which will take place after the submission deadline.
<b>Question 8</b>	<b>Can we submit an application in any EU language?</b>
Answer	Yes. In the light of article 125 (1) of the Financial Regulation: "Grants shall be subject to the principles of transparency and equal treatment". Applicants may therefore communicate with the European Commission in any EU language and can write their applications in any EU official languages." All the Call for Proposals documents and the application form are available in all EU official languages upon request. Translations can be requested up to the 28th July 2017, by email, to: eac-sport@ec.europa.eu.
<b>Question 9</b>	<b>What are third parties entitled to?</b>
Answer	<p>Third parties understood as final recipients of EU funds are excluded for this Call for Proposals, as stated in the Call for Proposals, section 11.7.d: "The applications may not envisage provision of financial support to third parties."</p> <p>Third parties understood as co-financing parties can participate to the project, as stated in section 11.4 of the Call for Proposals: "Co-financing of the action or of the work programme may take the form of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• the beneficiary's own resources,</li><li>• income generated by the action,</li><li>• financial contributions from third parties."</li></ul> <p>Third parties understood as subcontractors, i.e. economic operators providing a service, supply or works necessary for the action to the beneficiary, may not implement core activities and shall satisfy the conditions laid down in the Call for Proposals, section 11.7.c: "Where the implementation of the action requires the award of procurement contracts (implementation contracts), the beneficiary must award the contract to the bid offering best value for money or the lowest price (as appropriate), avoiding conflicts of interests. The beneficiary is expected to clearly document the tendering procedure and retain the documentation for the event of an audit. Entities acting in their capacity of contracting authorities in the meaning of</p>

	Directive 2014/24/EU4 or contracting entities in the meaning of Directive 2014/25/EU5 must comply with the applicable national public procurement rules"
<b>Question 10</b>	<b>Is there any required geographical coverage (e.g. EU , regional, national, local)?</b>
Answer	The Call for Proposals will only co-finance projects to be implemented within the EU.
<b>Question 11</b>	<b>How many projects are to be selected?</b>
Answer	The European Commission expects to fund approximately 20 projects.
<b>Question 12</b>	<b>Can a legal entity submit more than one proposal?</b>
Answer	Yes, the same legal entity can present several projects.
<b>Question 13</b>	<b>Can persons who have obtained a subsidiary protection eligible within this call?</b>
Answer	No. The call for proposals definition of the term "refugee" shall be complied with. This states that the term "refugee" indicates people having formal refugee status in an EU Member State as well as people who have officially applied for refugee status in the EU and whose applications have not yet been processed.
<b>Question 14</b>	<b>What are the statutory documents to be sent?</b>
Answer	They are described in the specifications under section 6.1. Eligible applicants as below: 'In order to assess the applicants' eligibility, the following supporting documents are requested: - private entity: extract from the official journal, copy of articles of association, extract of trade or association register, certificate of liability to VAT (if, as in certain countries, the trade register number and VAT number are identical, only one of these documents is required); - public entity: copy of the resolution or decision establishing the public company, or other official document establishing the public-law entity;'
<b>Question 15</b>	<b>Can applicants apply only with a completely new project or if it is possible to build on the existing project structure and develop it further into the next step of the integration?</b>
Answer	Please note that the Commission cannot financially support the same project by two different funding streams. However, if the project is the continuation of a successful project and is respecting the criteria as well as being aligned with the objectives of the given call there is no reason why this project could not be eligible for funding.
