

PASAG – PART B: WORKING GROUPS

The 7 working groups all address cross-cutting issues. For each group, a Commission correspondent has been assigned. The groups' composition including Chairs and members¹ are annexed.

The Task

Each working group is asked to produce a report, ideally no longer than 3 pages, with recommendations on how better to undertake the activities in the headline for each Group.

Timing

The output of **Groups 1-3** is sought to feed into the Secure Societies 2018-2020 work programme. This means that these 3 Groups must complete their reports by 15 September 2016 at the latest. It is proposed that draft reports, agreed by each group, be circulated to all PASAG members by 15 June 2016, to enable the reports to be agreed at the full PASAG meeting on 27 September 2016.

The output of **Groups 4-7** is primarily sought to feed into the next Framework Programme. Thus, while output in September 2016 would be welcome, it is not essential. However, it is proposed that these groups start work in 2016 with a view to finalising their reports in early 2017.

Ways of working

It is for each Chair to decide how best to complete the reports. However in order to keep the work manageable, it is suggested that in the first instance request for contributions/comments are sought from Groups members only. In order to expedite the work, Chairs may find it helpful to propose an initial outline for comments. And, in view of the number of e-mails circulating, it is desirable if all e-mails could state clearly the subject and whether for action or for information.

The groups can work by e-mail or may use other electronic means with appropriate security levels, hence allowing full compliance with the confidentiality rules set out in the PASAG mandate and the Declaration of Acceptance.

In addition, teleconferences can be arranged by the Commission correspondent for a given group if needed (contact Commission correspondent). Chairs are encouraged to arrange meetings during each PASAG meeting when the first 2 hours will be kept free for this purpose.
