HOW DO WE WORK?

- Improving water and sanitation infrastructure in 11 areas in Jordan and 25 communities in Lebanon, including fixing, upgrading and extending current water supply and sanitation networks.
- Building the capacities of water authorities and establishments in Jordan and Lebanon to improve the quality and sustainability of water supply and wastewater handling.
- Improving WASH facilities in 30 public institutions in Jordan and 32 in Lebanon, such as schools, prisons, health centres and child-friendly spaces.
- Ensuring that WASH facilities meet minimum standards, and that all people have equal access to drinking water.
- Setting up committees to ensure ongoing repair and maintenance of works in Jordan, and community outreach in 30 institutions (such as health clubs) in Jordan and 32 in Lebanon.
- Activities to fix and upgrade WASH and shelter facilities in 1,200 targeted households in Jordan.
