- Provide both Turkish and Syrian youngsters with greater access to quality education in a safe environment, with a particular focus on girls and out-of-school children.

HOW DO WE WORK?

- Building and expanding adequate **learning spaces** for 16,200 children.
- Providing essential **learning materials and classroom furniture** for the benefit of 40,000 children.
- Providing **teacher with financial support** for 1,850 Syrian volunteer teachers working in Temporary Education Centres.
- **Training** up to 3,700 Syrian volunteer teachers and Turkish teachers, helping to benefit 148,000 children.
- Developing communication strategies and carrying out far-reaching **information campaigns**.
- Providing **technical support** to the education authorities during planning and monitoring, coordination and standard setting processes.
- **Building a network** of 250 Syrian volunteer school counsellors, mentored and supported by Turkish school counsellors, and providing them with financial support.
- Providing training on Sexual and Gender Based Violence (SGBV) to 90 members of staff in **safe, child-friendly spaces**.
- Ensuring **girls get access to safe spaces** to meet specific counselling needs and referrals, with a focus on SGBV.
- Conducting **community-based peacebuilding** activities amongst 3,000 youth (such as a local awareness-raising campaigns, theatre performances, local festivals, debates, etc.)
- **Field monitoring, supervision and analysis** of changes in behaviour, based on existing academic experience in conflict mediation.
- **Turkish language classes** for up to 5,000 Syrian children.
- **Life skills training** for up to 5,000 Syrian children.
