- Reduce death and suffering due to chronic diseases among vulnerable Syrian and Lebanese people.
- Ensure access to medication in order to reduce the risk of further impoverishment and improve quality of life.

## HOW DOES IT WORK?

### **Uninterrupted supply of chronic medication:**

- Procure all necessary medication through a dedicated programme.
- Regularly supply primary healthcare centres with this medication.
- Monitor stocks management through cash flow/stocks monitoring system.

### **Upgrade the medication supply management system:**

- Carry out needs assessment to determine the IT equipment and training needs for establishing an efficient system at selected primary healthcare centres.

- Procure and install IT equipment for the system.
- Train health personnel on the dedicated programme for medication stock management.

### **Reinforced quality of care at primary healthcare level:**

- Update, print and disseminate national chronic disease management protocols.
- Train health workers on the application of the chronic disease management protocols.
- Conduct two quality of care assessments
