### EU Support to inclusive, equitable and quality education for Syrian children in refugee camps in Jordan

#### OBJECTIVE

- Improve the quality of education and enhance the capacity of the education system for Syrian refugee children, particularly in camp environments

#### EXPECTED RESULTS

- Teachers, administrators, and Supervisory Units are made available for the camp schools for Syrian students by the Ministry of Education.
- Quality education in the refugee camps is ensured and measured according to the Quality Performance Scores.
- Syrian and other refugee children (around 33,500) in camps receive school books and their tuition fees are covered.
- Services such as library, computer and science education in the camp schools are being delivered, and the related school staff and operational costs are covered.

## HOW DO WE WORK?

The specific objective is to support the Government of Jordan to increase access and deliver quality education to Syrian refugee children in kindergartens, primary and secondary schools in camps for the school years 2019-2020 and 2020-2021.

The main proposed activities are:

- Provision (contracts, salaries and transportation) of a sufficient number of teachers in order to optimise the teacher-pupil ratio, and of administrators;
- Provision (contracts, salaries and the transportation) of the MoE Supervisory Unit. The Supervisory Unit should support the identification of technical needs and priorities in school management and staff, conduct school visits to provide technical support to school leaders and staff, support camp schools to develop and implement school improvement plans, provide support to target schools in reporting/referral system for school based violence. All these aspects contribute to improvement of quality on education;
- Baseline survey for the schools in the camps within the first school year (2019-20)
- Monitoring Survey for the schools in the camps within the second school year (2020-21)
- Procurement of technical assistance services to the MoE in order (i) to continue monitoring the implementation of policy reforms in camps (in particular the access of Syrian children in camps to education), and the achievement of the budget support indicators; (ii) to contribute to monitoring the ESP with reference to Syrian refugees in the camps through external monitoring within the TA; iii) to establish a baseline for monitoring the quality of education in camps according to the same methodology used until now by EU external consultant;
- Distribution of text books;
- Payment of students' fees;
- Payment of operational costs including the electricity costs for the lightening of all the double shift schools in camps (operating also in afternoon) and for the utilisation of additional services such as computer and science laboratories, and libraries; payment of students' fees to sit for final exams at secondary school level (Tawjihi); payment of transportation for MoE staff.
